Dear Parents and Caregivers,

We **NEED** your support to ensure the safety of our students.

The staff carpark –is **NOT to be used by pedestrians as a shortcut in the mornings or afternoons.**

Please use the paths provided – and set a positive example for your children. (I have overheard a number of our boys and girls giving their carers a gentle reminder not to walk through the carpark recently – which is great, as it means our students are getting this important safety message!)

### Connecting Home and School Evening

Last week we hosted our Kindergarten Meet the Teacher session, as well as our annual Connecting School and Home event for all parents and students. We served about 400 sausage sandwiches – and enjoyed the company of many families from across the school, to celebrate the beginning of the school year. Many parents took the opportunity to meet their child's teacher and have an informal chat. This was a lovely social evening – and the feedback from parents on the night was extremely positive. Thank you to all those parents who spoke to Mrs Williams and I last week to tell us how much you enjoyed the changed format, with Yr1-6 teachers gathered in the hall. In the past, most parents have commented that they preferred having the information sent home – and taking the time to read it at their own leisure. Many expressed how much they liked the relaxed and welcoming atmosphere – and felt it was a lovely community event to start the year. If you have any other feedback regarding the evening, Mrs Williams and I would be pleased to hear from you.

## Uniform Reminder – Sports shorts and joggers on Friday only

It is wonderful to see all of our students now in the full school uniform. The feedback about the look and wearability of the Shelley uniform has been very positive.

Our P&C parent volunteers do an amazing job in the uniform shop and we thank them for their commitment of time and expertise. Sincere thanks to all of them. I know we are currently facing a shortage of school shirts and an urgent order was placed. We apologise for the delay and thank parents for your patience as the uniform stock arrives. Some shirts arrived today, and the owners of those orders have been contacted.

Just a reminder to all students and parents: the green microfibre sports shorts with the SPS logo are ONLY to be worn on Friday sports day. On Monday through to Thursday, students should be wearing either green shorts or culottes. Sports joggers are also only to be worn on Friday. (Black school shoes with white socks should be worn Monday to Thursday).

## Reminder to Parents

At Shelley PS we are proud of the way our students embrace the school's PBL values in demonstrating their abilities as Safe, Respectful and Responsible Learners. In our classrooms, our teachers and students constantly revisit what this means and what it "looks like" to be safe, respectful and responsible. We also greatly appreciate the role of parents in supporting the school's PBL values by reinforcing them with students and using the shared language we have developed through PBL and KidsMatter.

Unfortunately, very occasionally, we witness and become aware of some parents in our school community not upholding these values and in fact, setting a poor example for our students.

When parents and community members enter the school grounds, it is expected that their behaviour will be in accordance with the school's expectations.

Swearing, abusive, negative or racist comments towards or about others, is not acceptable. If you have a concern with another parent, and it is a school related matter, please make an appointment to see either Mrs Williams or myself, so the issue can be discussed and resolved. Where the issue is not related to school, I respectfully ask that parents keep these issues out of our school playground and away from the hearing of our students. Where parents or community members cannot abide by this, we will follow the DoE's procedures and where necessary, utilise the Inclosed Lands Act to exclude offenders from the school grounds.

My sincere thanks to the vast majority of our parents who are always supportive of our efforts to ensure Shelley PS continues to be a safe, friendly and welcoming school community for students, parents and teachers alike.

## Morning Assemblies

It is always great to see so many parents attend our morning assemblies – particularly the Monday morning K-6 assembly. The students and staff appreciate the involvement of community members in all aspects of school life.

We do however, need your assistance to ensure that these assemblies run smoothly and are a positive experience for all involved.

**If you are attending a morning assembly, please assist us by standing well back from the class lines.** It is important for the children to listen carefully at these assemblies- so holding conversations off until after the assembly would also be appreciated.

In the K-2 quad, we also ask that parents and pre-schoolers do not sit along the bench directly in front of the assembly – as this is very distracting for young children. There is a yellow line painted around the assembly area- as an indication for parents. Please remain behind the yellow lines to allow for the smooth flow of our assemblies.

## Mobile Phones at school

Mobile phones have become an integral part of our society and lifestyles. Whilst we recognise this trend, we strongly encourage Shelley primary students NOT to bring their mobile phones to school, unless absolutely necessary.

A reminder about the procedures for mobile phones at Shelley (as per DoE policy) - if it is essential for a student to bring a mobile phone to school they are required to:

- bring the mobile phone to the office each morning upon arrival at school and sign it in with a staff member.
- collect the phone from the office at 3pm and sign it out.

The sign in book for mobile phones will be kept behind the counter – all students MUST wait for one of the SAS Staff to assist them. Students MUST NOT just leave their mobile phone on the counter – no matter how busy the office is.

Please understand that students may need to wait a few moments to sign phones in and to pick them up in the afternoon.

Mobile phones are **NOT** to be kept with the student during the day and **MUST NOT** be used to take photos or videos at school.

If you are unsure about the importance of your child carrying a phone – please remember that the office staff are happy to assist with getting urgent messages to students about changes to pick up arrangements etc. Where it is urgent for a child to contact their parents, the office staff will likewise assist.



## P&C Meeting and AGM

The next P&C meeting will be the Annual General Meeting (AGM) on Monday 4th March at 7.00pm in Room 2. At this meeting, all executive positions will be declared open and elections will be held for the 2019 executive committee. Only financial P&C members are eligible to stand for these positions.

A President, two Vice-Presidents, a Secretary and a Treasurer will be elected, as per the standard and prescribed constitutions. No more than one officer position can be held by the same person.

Members of the same family can hold office-bearer positions at the same time. Office-bearers can be elected regardless of their place or type of employment.

The Executive committee is convened by the President or one other officer and is responsible for ensuring that the decisions of the P&C meeting are acted upon.

We look forward to a strong attendance at the AGM, to elect parents to these important roles in our P&C.

## Appointments / Phone calls to Teachers

If you have a concern or query about your child's learning, the staff at Shelley PS encourages all parents to let us know. The first "port of call" should always be the class teacher as they will have the best knowledge of your child's learning.

Remember, if at any time throughout the year, you have something you would like to discuss with your child's class teacher, you can either:

- Utilise the Shelley PS APP to request an interview. Click on the "More" tab on the home page, and then select Teacher Meetings Form. You will be able to nominate the teacher you would like to meet with, give some preferred dates and times and a brief description of the reason for the meeting. Completing this information will allow the teacher to get back to you with some available times, ensuring sufficient time is left for discussion about the issue or concern.
- Send a note to the class teacher requesting a meeting OR
- Telephone the school office requesting a meeting

Teachers will get back to you when they are able to organise a mutually suitable time to meet.

If it is an urgent matter, you can phone to talk to the teacher – but please be aware that teachers cannot take phone calls during the teaching day. Likewise, if you phone before or after school, many teachers may also have meetings. If you call after 8.45am, you may not be put through to the teacher as they are preparing for class.

Please be assured that we value open communication with parents, and our teachers will be happy to make an appointment to discuss your concerns at any time during the year.

Of course, if there is an emergency and you need to discuss something with us urgently, please phone the office and ask to speak to either myself, Mrs Williams or one of the Assistant Principals.

## Moving into Year 7 – 2020

This week, students who are currently in Year 6 will have brought home information about the transition to High School in 2020. The booklet will contain information about:

- moving to secondary school
- government secondary school options
- how to complete the expression of interest AND
- the expression of interest form.

The expression of interest form will be accompanied with a slip of paper with:

- the student's name
- the student's SRN (registration number)
- the home address
- name of designated local high school (based on the current residential address on record here at school).

All parents are asked to complete the expression of interest form and return to school **before Friday 15th March**. (Please note: the EOI should be completed for ALL students, including those who have applied for placement in a non-government school. If this is the case, and you have been guaranteed a place, please complete Section E – Placement not required).

**For those parents intending to apply for a placement at a non-local government school (out of area),** please read the requirements carefully and consult with the high school or our staff if unsure. You will need to thoroughly outline your reasons for seeking non-local placement. Many high schools will also require you to provide supporting evidence and documentation.

## Thirty Days of Kindergarten BBQ Reminder

It is hard to believe we are nearly halfway through Term 1 already. In two weeks, we will have our celebration of thirty days in Kindergarten and a special BBQ. Kindergarten parents, please make sure Friday 15th March is marked in your diary! Our newest students are settling very well into school life – and we look forward to celebrating this with parents and family members at our special welcome BBQ.



## Afternoon Pick – Up

Thank you to the majority of parents who have now returned the note outlining the afternoon pick-up arrangements for their children. This assists us to ensure the safe dismissal of our students each day.

I know many parents have arrangements amongst themselves to collect and take home each other's children. It is important that these arrangements are listed on the afternoon pick up note. **If there has been a change in your arrangements since the note was sent in, please ensure a note is written to your child's class teacher, outlining the new arrangements and listing those people who have permission to take your child home.**

I would like to remind parents that if there are no prior arrangements, you should NEVER take another student out of the school gate, even to help them go and look for their own parents. Whilst we appreciate that this is well intentioned, it can also cause unnecessary distress. The arrangement for all students is that if a parent / carer does not arrive to collect them as organised, students should go directly to the office. The office staff will then contact the parent, and children can wait safely in the office until they are collected. Parents – please assist us by reminding your child what to do if you, or their carer, are not at the designated meeting place in the afternoon.

**A reminder: waiting in the Principal's office is for emergency / urgent situations ONLY.** It should not be assumed that students can be left in the office, until the parent / carer arrives on a regular basis. Where parents / carers are unable to arrive by 3pm, it is requested that alternative arrangements are made for after school care.

Students waiting to be collected by High School siblings, are to wait on the silver seats in the K-2 area (under the small COLA). There is no teacher on supervision, and we ask parents to remind older siblings to arrive at school as quickly as possible each afternoon.

## International Women's Day

International Women's Day is celebrated on 8th March each year. It is a day to celebrate the contribution women have made across the world to their communities and the progress that has been made for equality in the workplace. It is also known as the United Nations (UN) Day for Women's Rights and International Peace and is a day to raise awareness about the unjust treatment that many women and children around the world are still facing.



The IWD 2019 campaign theme is “More Powerful Together” which recognises the important role we all play. It takes all of us, working in collaboration and across that which sometimes divides us, breaking down stereotypes and gendered roles to create a world where women and girls everywhere have equal rights and opportunities. May I take the opportunity to wish all women in the Shelley School community – teachers, mums, grandmothers and others- “Happy International Women's Day” for next Friday.

# What to pack for Crunch&Sip

**A bottle of plain water**

When it comes to thirst, choose water first! Give your child a bottle of water to take to school every day.

**A whole piece of fruit or veg**

Choose an easy to eat fruit or vegetable that isn't messy, such as a carrot, apple, mandarin or banana.

**Several whole, smaller fruit or veg**

Use a container or bag to pack snow peas, corn, mushrooms, strawberries or grapes, for example.

**Chopped fruit or veg**

Pack a container of bite sized pieces of fruit or vegetables such as watermelon, mango, broccoli or cauliflower. If needed, remember to include a fork or spoon to avoid sticky fingers.

**Veggie sticks**

Cucumber, capsicum, celery and carrot are great options.

**Canned fruit**

Fresh fruit and veg are best, but fruit canned in water or natural juice is OK **every now and then**.

**Dried fruit**

For example, apple, mango, apricots or sultanas, a **maximum of once a week**.

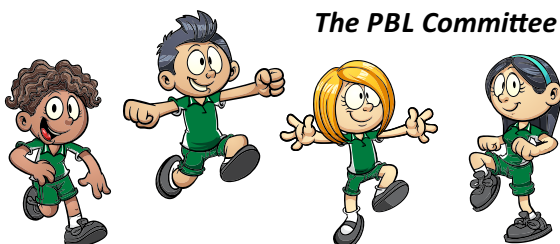
## PBL Update

# Speechie Corner

My name is Sophie Gill and I am a qualified Speech Pathologist who works for Educational Speech Pathology & Therapy Services.

My main role will be to **work with your teachers** in the whole classroom to support the speaking and listening skills of the children. Your school is generously funding this program to both support your children and to build teacher capacity.

If your child already attends speech therapy outside of school **please do not stop attending**. The Educational Speech Pathology program cannot offer the same individualised therapy your child will receive through either Community Health or Private speech therapy.

Parents, it is important to note that you cannot refer your child directly to the Speech Pathologist. I will be carrying out a program in Stage 1 classes. The approach has been planned collaboratively with your child's teachers and integrates a mixture of expressive and receptive language goals, along with goals focussing on spelling and sound development.

## Language Difficulties: "Red Flags"

### What is receptive language?

The ability to understand the language that we hear including words, sentences and the meaning of what others say.

### What is expressive language?

Being able to express what we think, want and need. How well a child can put this information into words and sentences that make sense.

### When should you be worried about your child's language?

- If your child has a history of being a late talker or having trouble with their speech sounds it is always a good idea to keep a close eye on their oral language too.
- Others find it hard to understand the message your child is trying to express. Your child's talk might be
  - out of order (poorly sequenced),
  - vague (full of words like thing and stuff and you know),
  - the sentences may be ungrammatical or incomplete, or
  - the listener might have to ask a lot of questions to clarify what is meant.
- Your child has trouble understanding what other people say, for example they might have difficulty
  - Following instructions,
  - Might give "odd or unusual answers" because they haven't understood the question,
  - Might not be able to understand what they read because they don't know the meanings of words or sentences.
- Your child has trouble saying what they want and may become frustrated.
- Your child has behavioural problems because they can't explain a problem or understand the language being used in that situation.

### What to do if you are worried about your child's language?

- Discuss the problems with your child's teacher.
- Get your child's hearing and vision tested.
- You can make a time to come to see me at Shelley PS to discuss your concerns - [phone 9622 8359](tel:96228359).
- Go to see a Speech Pathologist.

## P & C Association

### Office Bearers and their Duties

The Executive Committee consists of the officers of the association and up to six other members and carries out the decisions of the association. Members of the Executive Committee shall not receive any remuneration or other material benefit by reason of their position in the association.

The officers shall consist of President, two Vice-Presidents, Treasurer and Secretary, and shall be elected at the annual general meeting.

#### The President

- Shall preside at all meetings
- Liaise with the Principal and the staff
- Be a spokesperson for the parents of the school, both within the school and in the general community
- Be an ex officio member of all subcommittees.

#### The Vice President

- Shall carry out all the duties of the President when they are absent from meetings
- Will assist the President when ever needed to ensure the smooth running of the P & C Association
- Is responsible for co-ordinating the Canteen and liaising between the Canteen Supervisor, the Canteen Committee and the P & C Association.

#### The Junior Vice President

- Shall carry out the duties of the President if both the President and the Vice President are absent.
- Will assist the President and Vice President as required
- Will be responsible in overseeing the Fundraising of the P & C Association.

#### The Secretary

- Shall carry out the official correspondence of the P & C Association
- Will maintain communication with the President regarding any action required between meetings
- Will take minutes of all association meetings – they may use a tape recorder if they would like to
- Will count the number of people attending each Association meeting.

#### The Treasurer

- Shall receive and deposit monies, maintain records, draw cheques and present accounts to each general meeting
- Present all records for auditing each year and shall hand over all records to the incoming Treasurer on relinquishing office.
- The requirements for handling money, keeping records, etc, in the School Manual on Financial Management shall be followed.

#### Executive Members

Executive members are required to help and contribute wherever they can and to help on the subcommittees of the Canteen and Uniform Shop.

To hold a position on any of the P & C Committees or to vote or nominate anyone for a position, you must be a financial member of the P & C.

Gaining membership is easy. Simply pay \$2.00 to the Treasurer on the night of the AGM prior to it starting, or put your \$2.00 in an envelope marked with your name, address and phone number and place it in the P & C box at the canteen.





## P & C News



The Shelley Public School P&C Association is a not-for-profit organisation which is established to promote the interests of the school by bringing parents, citizens and teaching staff together to assist in providing equipment and funding to the school to help maximise our children's education.

Membership of the P&C is open to all parents, guardians and citizens of the school. Shelley's P&C meets on the first Monday of each month at 7pm in Room 2 and we are always keen to welcome new members.

### Our next meeting is Monday 4th February

Our AGM is on Monday 4th March, during which our Executive Committee will be elected for the year.

There are several ways which you are able to be involved in the P&C. This can include raising money to purchase equipment, providing a service such as helping with the covering of books, volunteering your time to help in the Uniform Shop or Canteen (both P&C owned and operated), supporting fundraisers such as purchasing raffle tickets, attending P&C meetings and becoming a financial member.

Becoming a financial member of the P&C is only \$2 per year and allows you voting rights in the meetings and copies of all general meeting minutes. If you wish you may also stand to be a member of the Executive Committee. All executive positions are currently advertised in the school newsletter. You do not have to be available at the school every day to be a member, in fact many of our members work, some full time, some part time, but being a part of the P&C is very rewarding as we primarily do what we do for our children.

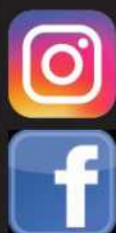
