Tell Them from Me PARENT Survey - All parents K-6

This Term, our school will also be participating in the Partners in Learning parent survey, another part of the Tell Them From Me suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, iPads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted between 26 August and 25 October. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated. The survey is available in 23 languages.

Top Field Update

A couple of parents / grandparents have spoken to me about the condition of our top field, particularly in relation to the bindies. The top field was sprayed last weekend. However, we have been working over a number of months with the Department's Asset Management Unit to get some plans in place for major improvements to this play area. I am currently waiting for a final report from Sydney Soil Conservation Services, which will include the recommendations for some staged plans for improvements to ensure the re-turfing is cost-effective and sustainable. I will keep you informed of our plans for Top Field improvements via the newsletter.

Dogs on School Grounds

On occasion some of our parents have recently been bringing dogs onto school grounds. If you are coming to school to collect your child, and you are bringing a dog with you, we respectfully request that:

- You wait **outside the school gate** with the dog, and have your child meet you there.
- The dog remains on a leash at all times.

Although I am sure that these dogs, as family pets, are well loved and trusted, please understand that any dog can act in an unexpected way in a new environment and particularly when there are large numbers of children



around. There are also many young children who are unfamiliar with dogs, who may either feel scared, or may startle an animal in their own enthusiasm to greet the dog.



Speechie Corner - Do a child's crossword puzzle

How? You can find books in a book store or search online "child's free crossword puzzle" there are many places you can find them for free.

Why? This will help to develop your child's vocabulary and spelling, as well as their ability to comprehend the question.

What do I look for? That your child can attempt to answer the questions correctly, that they can use the letters already in the word to help answer a word they are stuck on and that your child is correctly spelling the words (otherwise the other clues will not fit).

How do I make it easier? Sit with your child to help them when they need assistance, you can reword the question to make it easier if they need or you can explain what the question is asking. See if your child understands the question and can get the answer themself. Your child may also need help spelling the word to make it fit correctly in the squares.

Statement of Attainment in Introduction to Education Support (3 units)

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The training will provide you with the knowledge and skills to participate in a classroom at a school supporting teachers and working with children. *This* Statement of Attainment is only 3 units of an Education Support qualification.

1 day per week for 7 weeks face to face learning with additional work to be completed in your own time. You will also be required to complete work placement in a classroom for at least 21 hours, putting into practice the knowledge and skills you have learnt.
