

### **Speechy Corner**

An activity to complete this fortnight... play "Modified Scattegories"

#### How?

Write category words on individual pieces of paper and then place them into a box. (E.g. colour, size, texture, shape, animals, food, transport, sports, clothing etc.) Write all the letters of the alphabet and place them into a separate box. Ask your child to pick one piece of paper from each box i.e. one category, one letter.

Tell your child the aim of the game is to write down as many words relating to the category chosen that start with the letter that was chosen. For example, if the category is texture and the the letter is 's' they could write down smooth, slimy, sticky, slippery etc.

The child is given a time frame of your choosing (e.g. 3 minutes) and is to write down all of the words they have thought of. After the time is up, the child will read out all the words they have come up with.

#### Why?

To practice and revise new vocabulary.

#### What do I look for?

Make sure they are writing words starting with the right letter and that they match the category.

#### How can I make this easier?

- Take away the time limit
- Use pictures to help prompt your child

#### How do I make it harder?

If you are playing with multiple people, you can play in teams. The team that gets the most words will get a point and those who win the most points at the end wins the game!


