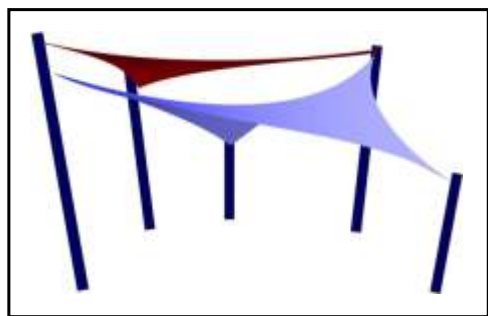

## Playground Construction and Top Field Improvements



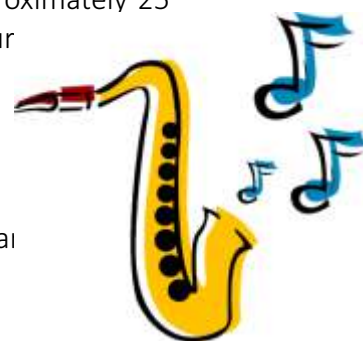
Work on our K-2 Shade Sails was scheduled to take place during the holidays, but unfortunately due to some delays the Shade Sails will not be completed for another week or two. We are looking forward to the benefits of this new shade shelter, which will cover both the silver seats and the sandpits in the K-2 playground.

As I mentioned in the newsletter last year, we have been working with our Asset Management Unit over the last 12 months trying to establish costs and plans for some major work on our top field. This is much needed and long overdue. Recently, we signed off to have the first stage of work done. (This is a school funded project and we have to ensure we had budgeted the funds to cover such extensive and major work). This year in addition to preliminary preparation work, we will be having new turf installed, as well as a new drainage swale and pit and new irrigation. Although the tender has been awarded, I do not yet have a start date for this project, but will keep the school community informed, as soon as I know more.

## Shelley PS Training Band

Our Shelley PS Band program commenced on Wednesday. We have approximately 25 students in our first Training Band. The students had their first tutorials during school day and their first band practice in the hall in the afternoon. ## Home School Partnership

We greatly value the importance of good communication between the school and parents. If you have a concern or query about your child's learning, the staff at Shelley PS encourages all parents to let us know.

The first "port of call" should always be the class teacher as they will have the best knowledge of your child's learning. If you would like to make an appointment to speak to your child's teacher please either send a note, make an appointment request via the school APP or contact the office.

If it is an urgent matter, you can phone to talk to the teacher – but please be aware that teachers cannot take phone calls during the teaching day. Likewise, if you phone before or after school, many teachers may also have meetings. If you call after 8.45am, you may not be put through to the teacher as they are preparing for class.

## Swimming Carnival

Notes regarding our annual Swimming Carnival will be sent home today. The Swimming Carnival will be held on Thursday 18th February at Ripples Leisure Centre, St Marys.

Although I know many non-swimmer students may be disappointed about not being able to attend the carnival, this decision has been made with the safety of students in mind. In past years we have had growing numbers of non-swimmers at our Swimming Carnival. Whilst we have always tried to provide appropriate activities for non-swimmers, this has become increasingly difficult, as up to 75% of students attending are identified as non-swimmers. Obviously if we are to run non-swimmer water activities, we require much higher staff to student ratios – to ensure the safety of our students. This then leaves us short staffed to run the competitive carnival to high standards.

For that reason, we now only take those students who are satisfactory, good or excellent swimmers who are going to compete in either the 25m or 50m events.

With continued spates of drownings across NSW, I am sure you will agree that the safety of all students is paramount and we thank you for your understanding regarding these changes.

We look forward to our swimmers having a successful 2020 Carnival.

A reminder for parents of non-swimmers – we will be holding our annual swimming school later in the year and offer this as a great opportunity as part of your child's development to become a confident, capable swimmer.

**Parents will note that we are again ONLY taking competitors, who can swim and intend to compete in the 50 metre or 25 metre events. There are NO water activities for non-swimmers.**

**Non-swimmers will remain at school.**

## Coronavirus

A few parents have contacted us with concerns about Coronavirus and the associated risks. We have received the following advice:

“The NSW Ministry of Health and NSW Department of Education have recommended that any student who was travelling in China (including Hong Kong) over the past 14 days should not return to school or child care services this week, as the coronavirus' incubation period can be as long as two weeks.

Students who returned to Australia more than 14 days ago and have shown no symptoms are able to return to school this week.

There has been a small number of cases of confirmed Novel Coronavirus in New South Wales.

In accordance with national public health guidelines, exclusions only apply for those who are a:

- Confirmed case of Novel Coronavirus – exclude until medically cleared
- Close contact of a confirmed case of Novel Coronavirus – exclude for 14 days since last contact with the confirmed case

Close contact is defined as living in the same household, 15 minutes face-to-face contact with a person with confirmed coronavirus in any setting, or sharing a closed space with a person with confirmed coronavirus for more than 2 hours.

The Ministry of Health has processes in place to identify any close contacts of cases confirmed in Australia. Advice about not attending school would be provided to these close contacts by the Ministry of Health.

Consistent with current guidelines, staff and students who are unwell with respiratory illness should remain at home until symptoms resolve. In accordance with our current practice if any child becomes unwell we will implement our infection control guidelines and follow the advice provided by the Ministry of Health as appropriate.

We will continue to monitor the situation closely and take advice received from NSW Ministry of Health and NSW Department of Education to ensure we are responding to the situation appropriately”.

## Home School Communication

We are committed to the parent / school partnership at Shelley. We encourage you to be involved in many aspects of school life. We also strive to keep you well informed and therefore have a range of communication tools.

### Shelley Newsletter

The newsletter is the KEY form of communication. We publish a fortnightly newsletter and ask all parents to take some time to read it on a regular basis, so that you are always well informed about school activities.

**The newsletter is sent home via email every second FRIDAY.** Please keep an eye out for the newsletter and keep up to date with current events.

On the **alternate Friday**, we send home a **Shelley Spotlight**, which includes reminders about important dates and upcoming payments, as well as the names of students receiving a Super Star badge at the next K-6 assembly.

If you have not provided the school with your current email address, please do so as soon as possible via the app or using the change of details form available at the office.

The Shelley PS Skoolbag APP is another important communication tool **which we use on a regular basis to send important reminders and urgent messages.** If you have not yet downloaded the APP, which is available for both iPhone and android devices, please take the opportunity to do as we commence the school year. The APP is free – and available from your preferred app store.

### Social Media: Instagram and Facebook

In order to help our parents stay in touch with what is happening at Shelley, we also use some social media platforms.

Shelley PS has a Facebook page, as well an Instagram account, which are used to acknowledge the amazing work done by students and teachers of Shelley and to showcase the many events and activities that take place here every week. (Please note: the social media accounts are a **secondary** form of communication – and should not

be relied upon for reminders about upcoming events etc. We encourage all families to access the newsletter and app as the core communication tools). Please do not send questions or queries via the Facebook page – as the response may be delayed.

Of course, both social media platforms will be closely monitored and managed. The Facebook page is for use by parents (none of our students should have Facebook accounts anyhow, as they are under 13 years of age).

## Photographs of Students at School

On many occasions at school, photographs are taken by teachers of individual students, groups or whole classes. These photos are sometimes displayed in classrooms, published in newsletters or on the website and used for instructional or promotional purposes. At Shelley PS, children are generally not identified by name (and if so – only ever by their first name).

During the year, we may also have professional photographers at school to take photos for school banners and other promotions. We will also be taking photographs of some of our new Kindergarten students, in preparation for the Kinder welcome packages for 2021. Photos may also be used on the school's social media sites, including Instagram and Facebook.

When enrolling your child, all parents were asked to complete a permission to publish section within the enrolment form. I have provided the information from that from below for your reference.

### Publishing student information

The school/Department may publish information about your child for the purposes of sharing his/her experiences with other students, informing the school and broader community about school and student activities and recording student participation in noteworthy projects or community service.

This information may include your child's name, age, class and information collected at school such as photographs, sound and visual recordings of your child, your child's work and expressions of opinion such as in interactive media.

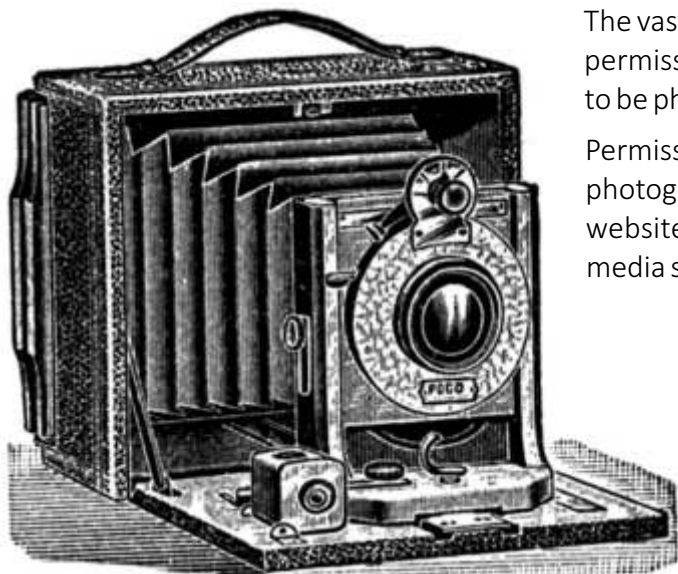
The communications in which your child's information may be published include but are not limited to:

- Public websites of the Department including the school website, the Department's intranet (staff only), blogs and wikis
- Departmental publications including the school newsletter, annual school magazine and school report, promotional material published in print and electronically including on the Department websites
- Official departmental and school social media accounts on networks such as the school's YouTube, Facebook and Twitter pages.

Parents should be aware that when information is published on public websites and social media channels it can be linked to by third parties and may be discoverable online for a number of years, if not permanently. Search engines may also cache or retain copies of published information.

The majority of our parents have then signed the following Permission to Publish:

- I have read the information about publishing student information (above) and I give permission / I do not give permission for the school/Department to publish information about my child in publicly accessible communications. **This permission remains effective until I advise otherwise.**



The vast majority of Shelley parents have already signed this permission, and therefore if you are still happy for your child to be photographed, you don't need to do anything.

Permission to publish includes all forms of school use of photography (photos used in the classroom, newsletter, website, local newspaper articles, official school social media sites and DoE publications).

**If you DO NOT wish for your child to be photographed when at school, or for their photos to be used, please notify the school via email ([shelley-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au](mailto:shelley-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au)) or in writing by the end of Week 2 (Friday 7th February).**

## School Uniform

Thank you mums and dads, for ensuring your children were dressed in full Shelley uniform for their return to school. I trust this high standard will continue throughout the year. (Thanks too – to our parent volunteers Tracey and Larissa who have worked so hard in the Uniform Shop this week, to ensure parents had the opportunity to purchase new uniforms).

As mentioned in the note on Wednesday, due to overwhelming demand, the Uniform Shop has sold out of Size 8, 10 and 12 shirts at the moment. Whilst they had very good stock levels for the start of the year, unusually large purchases have meant a short-fall. Orders have been placed and we will have new shirts as soon as possible. Thank you for your support and understanding. (Unfortunately the Uniform Shop cannot exceed standard “stock on hand” levels due to the costs and insurance cover).

Just a couple of important uniform reminders:

- The sports shorts should only be worn on Friday. On Monday – Thursday, students should be wearing green culottes or green shorts.
- **Socks** A reminder – that with the school uniform, all students wear white socks. Socks should be fold down short socks (NOT the ankle socks, which slide down under the shoes).

- **School Shoes**

On Monday through to Thursday, all students are to wear **black school shoes** (Lace-up, Buckle or Velcro). This includes black leather or leather-look school shoes, such as those illustrated below. There should be no other colour on the school shoes, and no sneakers / high top boots or converse style shoes.

On Fridays, all students wear sports shoes / joggers. The preferred colour for sports shoes is white. We understand plain white sports shoes are sometimes difficult to source, and most students will wear white with some colour. Students should not wear bold, colourful or bright fluorescent joggers.



## Recess and Lunch



As we begin a new school year, it is timely to think about the significance of a healthy and balanced diet for our children.

It is very important for all children to have not only a healthy breakfast before coming to school, but also sufficient food to see them through the school day.

A healthy diet, and regular snacks / meals assist children to maintain their concentration and increases their capacity to learn.

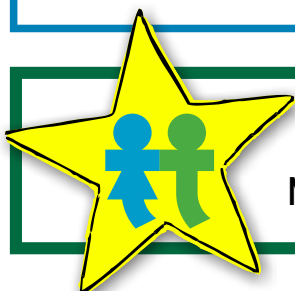

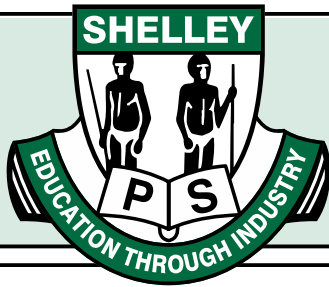

# Shelley Public School

## P & C Association

### Office Bearers and their Duties

The Executive Committee consists of the officers of the association and up to six other members and carries out the decisions of the association. Members of the Executive Committee shall not receive any remuneration or other material benefit by reason of their position in the association.

The officers shall consist of President, two Vice-Presidents, Treasurer and Secretary, and shall be elected at the annual general meeting.

#### The President

- Shall preside at all meetings
- Liaise with the Principal and the staff
- Be a spokesperson for the parents of the school, both within the school and in the general community
- Be an ex officio member of all subcommittees.

#### The Vice President

- Shall carry out all the duties of the President when they are absent from meetings
- Will assist the President when ever needed to ensure the smooth running of the P & C Association
- Is responsible for co ordinating the Canteen and liaising between the Canteen Supervisor, the Canteen Committee and the P & C Association.

#### The Junior Vice President

- Shall carry out the duties of the President if both the President and the Vice President are absent.
- Will assist the President and Vice President as required
- Will be responsible in overseeing the Fundraising of the P & C Association.

#### The Secretary

- Shall carry out the official correspondence of the P & C Association
- Will maintain communication with the President regarding any action required between meetings
- Will take minutes of all association meetings – they may use a tape recorder if they would like to
- Will count the number of people attending each Association meeting.

#### The Treasurer

- Shall receive and deposit monies, maintain records, draw cheques and present accounts to each general meeting
- Present all records for auditing each year and shall hand over all records to the incoming Treasurer on relinquishing office.
- The requirements for handling money, keeping records, etc, in the School Manual on Financial Management shall be followed.

#### Executive Members

Executive members are required to help and contribute wherever they can and to help on the subcommittees of the Canteen and Uniform Shop.

To hold a position on any of the P & C Committees or to vote or nominate anyone for a position, you must be a financial member of the P & C.

Gaining membership is easy. Simply pay \$2.00 to the Treasurer on the night of the AGM prior to it starting, or put your \$2.00 in an envelope marked with your name, address and phone number and place it in the P & C box at the canteen.



# P & C News



The Shelley Public School P&C Association is a not-for-profit organisation which is established to promote the interests of the school by bringing parents, citizens and teaching staff together to assist in providing equipment and funding to the school to help maximise our childrens' education.

Membership of the P&C is open to all parents, guardians and citizens of the school. Shelley's P&C meets on the first Monday of each month at 7pm in Room 2 and we are always keen to welcome new members.

### Our next meeting is Monday 3rd February

Our AGM is on Monday 2nd March, during which our Executive Committee will be elected for the year.

There are several ways which you are able to be involved in the P&C. This can include raising money to purchase equipment, providing a service such as helping with the covering of books, volunteering your time to help in the Uniform Shop or Canteen (both P&C owned and operated), supporting fundraisers such as purchasing raffle tickets, attending P&C meetings and becoming a financial member.

## GTi Entrance Test for 2021

### On 20th February 2020

#### What is GTi?

Our **Gifted Talented and interested** class is designed for students in year 6 2020 who have above average academic ability and who may possess talents not always reflected in the style of test provided by the Selective High School Placement Unit, such as arts, computers and music.

#### Why choose GTi?

The **Gifted Talented and interested** class follows the same curriculum as the Selective class and undertakes the same internal assessment processes.

It has the added advantage of being a pathway to positions in the Selective class should vacancies occur, subject to formal application procedures.

#### How to gain entry?

Main entry is via the **GTi** test held at Blacktown Boys High (*registration details below*), with a small number of places reserved for Primary School recommendations and further testing.

#### Test Details:

This test will cover literacy, numeracy and general knowledge.

The test for registered students will be held in the **Blacktown Boys Hall** at **4.00pm to 5.45pm** on **Thursday 20th February 2020**.

A place can be registered either in person, by phone, or by filling in the Parent Nomination Form available on the school website, no later than the **17th February 2020**.

All materials will be provided by the school on payment of the **non refundable \$10** entry fee covering printing and marking costs.

This fee can be paid in advance over the phone via eftpos or **cash only** on the day.
