## Year 6 Excursion to Canberra

As part of their studies in History and Geography, during Week 7 of the term, our senior students undertook an educational tour of the nation's capital.

To support the learning taking place in the classroom, students had the opportunity to participate in a range of educational programs in Canberra. Our itinerary included programs at Parliament House, the Museum of Democracy, the Australian War Memorial, the National Portrait Gallery, the Australian Institute of Sport and Questacon.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion, the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$30 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate Program towards these costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion. (NB: This rebate was utilized in calculating the cost of the camp for parents).

The camp was a very busy, yet memorable three-day experience for our students. Their behaviour was of the highest standard and we received numerous compliments on the way our students conducted themselves in public and the smart appearance of our uniform. Thank you, parents for your assistance on this matter and well done students!
